The Council reviewed the CAAR Strategic Plan and learned that all of the groups will be updating the document as they identify their projects for the new year. CAAR is incorporating diversity, equity, and inclusion in all aspects of the Association.

CEO Update

Staffer Teresa Kirkhart was thanked for serving as the primary staff liaison for the Broker Council.

The CAAR Foundation is working with a consultant to finalize a Strategic Plan by April 2023. From there, the Board Chair, Tammy Wilt, and Vice Chair, Greg Slater, will lead the group in the identified area of community support and fundraising. The Foundation will also be hiring a dedicated staff member to lead the organization.
